

Filippo Monge is graduated in Business Economics from the University of Torino and he completed his studies at London School of Economics and Political Science.

In the 1990s he was an advisor to the Italian Government's Minister for European Policies.

In 1993 he started as invited lecturer @SAA- School of Management of University of Torino; later, in 1999, he has been adjunct professor first at *Cà Foscari*- University of Venice and then, **from 2000, at University of Torino**. He worked (2000-2002) as a junior researcher in the Italian Government destination marketing and local development programs.

From 2010 to 2012 he was a member of National Council for Economy and Labour (CNEL, Italian Government) and, later, member of the board of "*Istituto Guglielmo Tagliacarne*" (Rome) by appointment of the Minister of Economic Development.

He is currently an associate professor¹ of Business Management and Innovation Economics (University of Torino), former visiting fellow of CNEL (Italian Government). He was visiting professor (2005-2007) at MEDAC, University of Malta. Since 2007 he is an adjunct professor of "*Parcours Binational*" (University of Turin-Université "Jean Moulin"- Lyon).

Since 2020 he is the scientific coordinator of an international executive master in local development. His research interests include innovation management, financial education (for business survival), local development and customer satisfaction. In 2016 he was awarded ANCE Gold Medal for his services (R&D) to construction economics.

Thanks to his specific expertise he served on the boards of directors of private and public companies and organizations.
